Movement disorders are very varied and often chronic. Their optimal treatment, therefore, requires a stable interdisciplinary approach. For the development of such an interdisciplinary approach IAB - Interdisciplinary Working Group for Movement Disorders was founded in Hamburg in 2006. In the meantime several regional centres were formed.

IAB offers Communication, Education, Information, for all who want to collaborate in movement disorders. IAB supports interdisciplinary therapies in movement disorders, facilitates internal communication amongst therapists and external communication with patients, colleagues and institutions.

IAB is based upon regional centres regularly organising forums for medical and nonmedical therapists where the latest information about movement disorders and their therapies is exchanged.

Special interest groups for Parkinson assistants and for pediatrics are covering special needs.

The meeting branch organises CME accredited meetings in movement disorders. The publication branch produces scales for measuring movement disorders and their therapies as well as material for improvement of interdisciplinary communication amongst therapists. It also produces DVDs about selected topics in movement disorders.

The webpage is the central marketplace for exchange of information. It consists of a calendar of events, featuring all events of the different regions. a database containing information about the members with their therapeutic specialties.

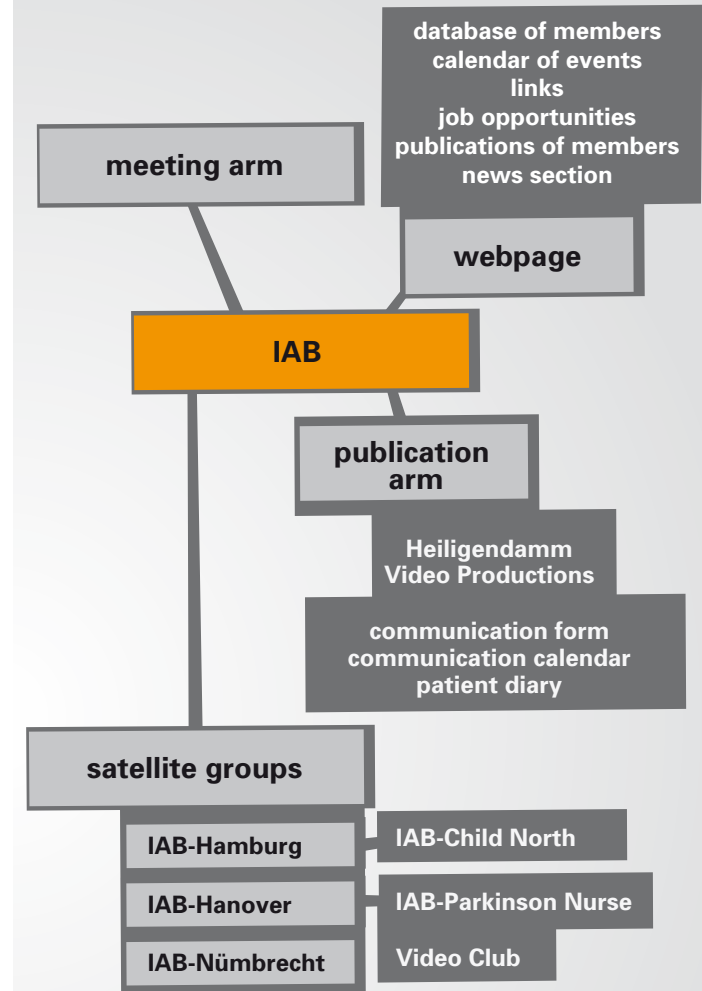
